

PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND THE DIRECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, MINISTRY OF HEALTH

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Preamble

The Performance Agreement is entered into between the Secretary of Health and the Director, Department of Public Health.

The objectives of this Performance Agreement are:

- a) To establish clarity and consensus about annual priorities for the Department of Public Health consistent with the 12th Five Year Plan of the Ministry, and the Government's other priorities;
- b) To provide an objective and fair basis for evaluating the overall performance of the Department of Public Health at the end of the financial year;

The Performance Agreement represents an important accountability mechanism for inculcating a performance based culture at all levels of government.
